- **Multimats x2** (for Colouring/Art & Craft/Loose Parts/Playdough)

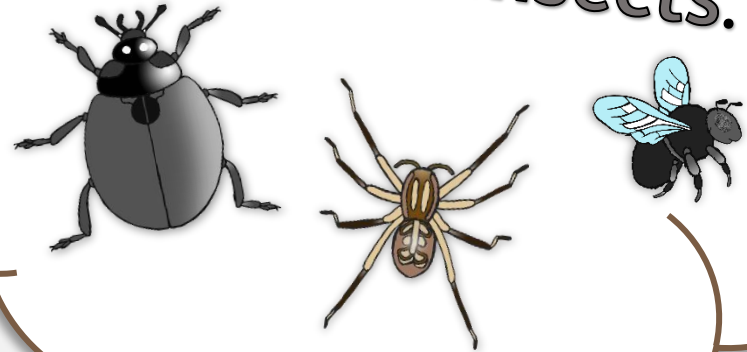

Bats eat insects.



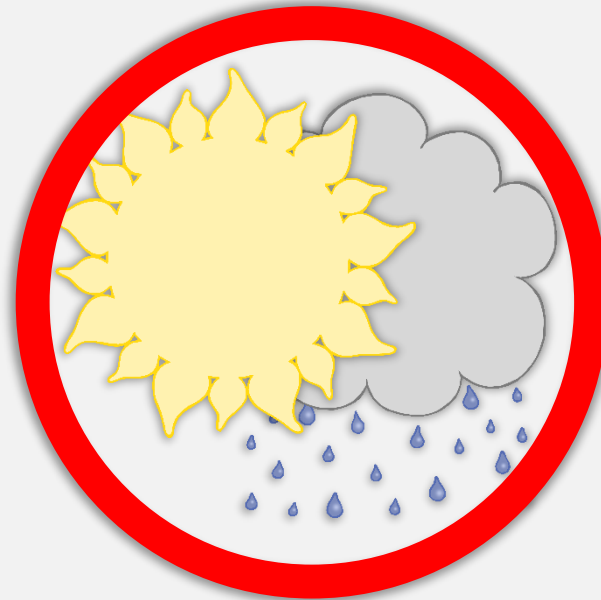
Bats are the only mammal that can fly.

Humans have destroyed lots of places in which bats make their homes.

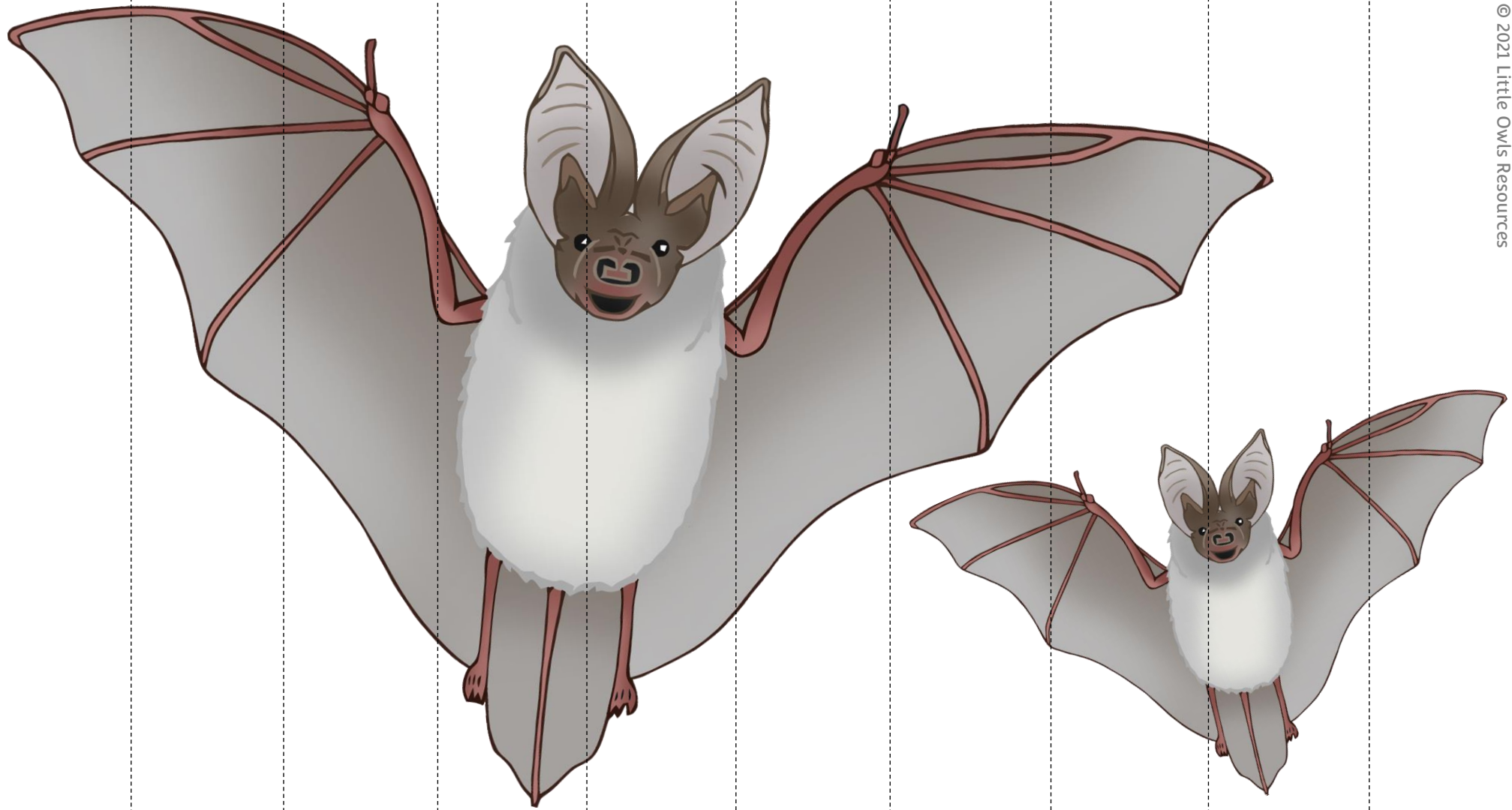

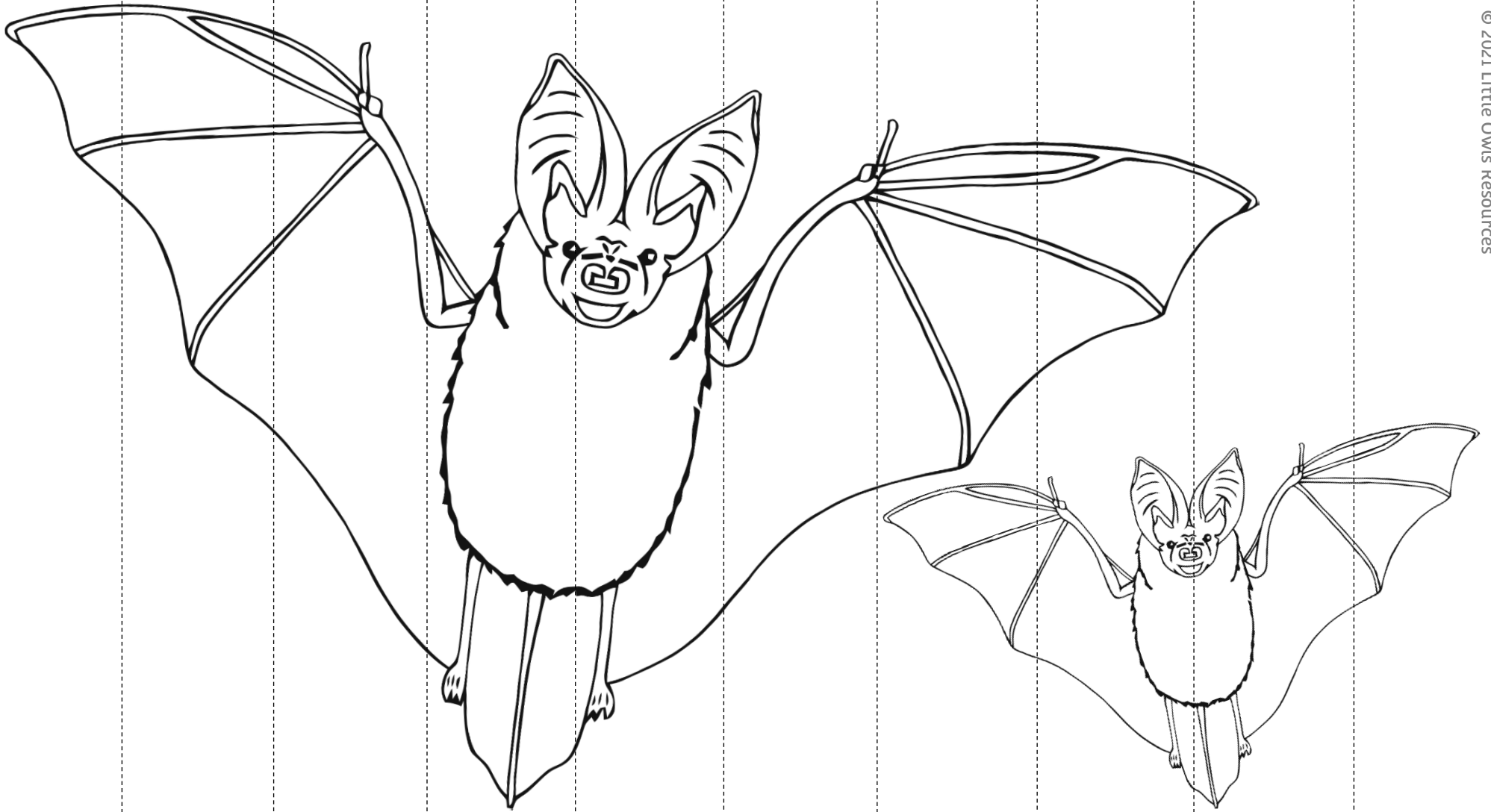
