The pages of this pack give some general information about gorillas and some fun and engaging activities to foster and develop children's interest in them.

Gorillas are the ***BIGGEST*** apes in the world!

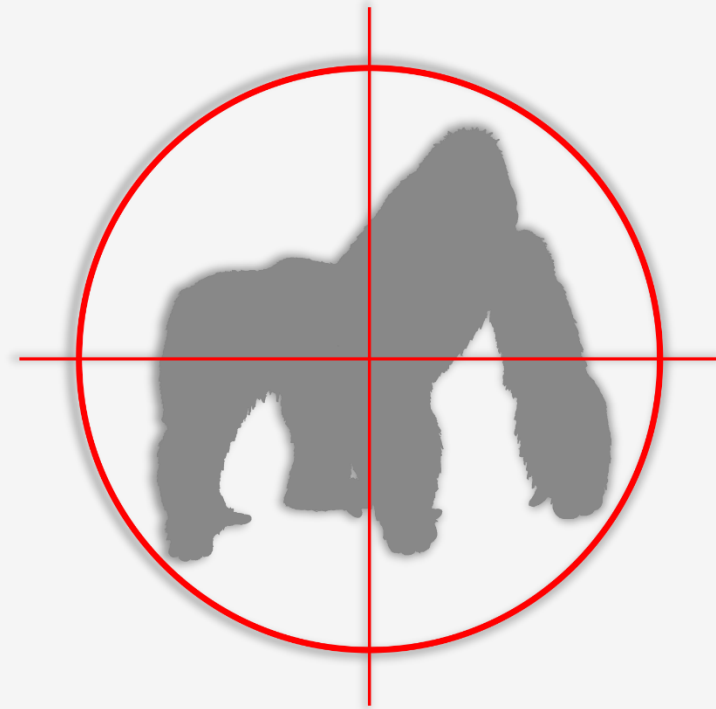


Gorillas are **Endangered**.

Humans have destroyed lots of places that gorillas used to live.

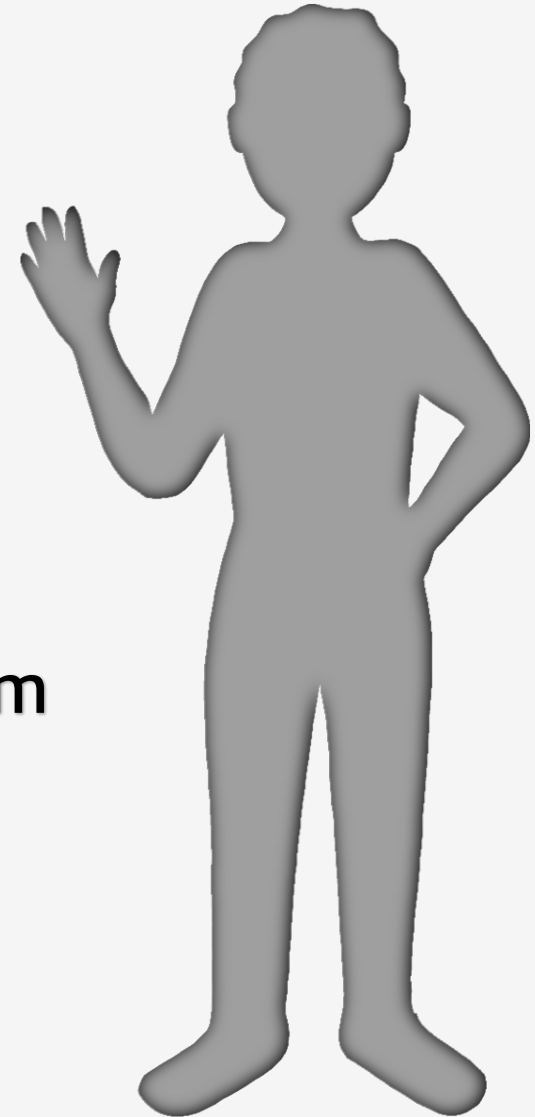


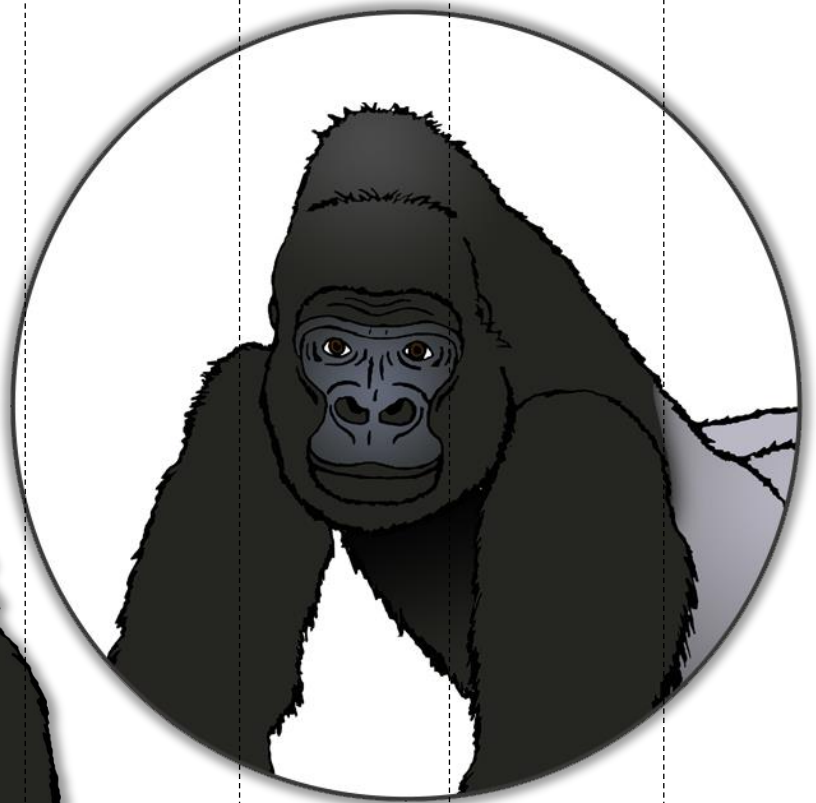
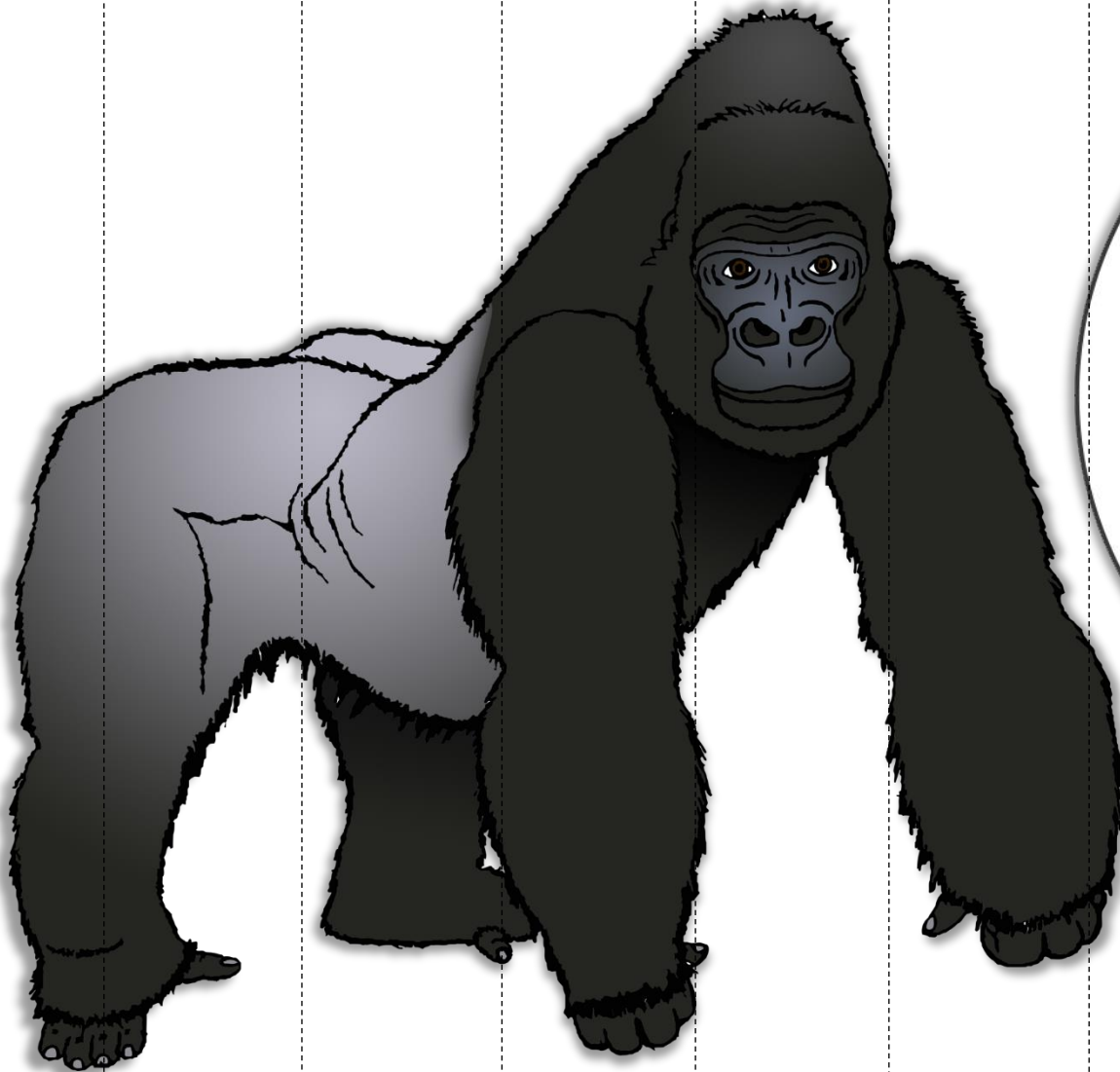
