Help children to match their counting words with objects e.g. count objects which can be moved in the outdoor area such as stones, sticks, small world characters, bricks...


- Move an object to one side once they have counted it.
- (If children are saying one number word for each object, it is not always necessary to correct them if they skip a number. Learning to count accurately takes a long time and repeated experience. Confidence is important.)

- Use spatial words like 'on top of, 'up’, 'down' and 'through'.
