


Rabbit



The pages of this pack give some general information about rabbits and some fun and engaging activities to foster and develop children's interest in them.

This pack includes:

- **Fact posters x2** (Could be used as stimuli for a lesson input)
- **Pompom mat** (Can be used for matching colours. Moving soft pompoms also promotes fine motor skills)
- **Number slice activity (1-10)** (Can be pre-cut for a pure number ordering activity or left to be cut by child to add scissor practice)
- **Number slice activity - colouring version (1-10)** (As above but to be coloured before cutting)
- **Descriptive words poster** (Could be used as stimuli for a lesson input)
- **Descriptive words writing sheet** (Can be used as an independent writing activity or with an adult scribing the ideas of a younger child)
- **A4 poster**
- **A4 poster - colouring version**
- **'Body Parts' x3** (fully labelled, initial sounds only, blank)
- **Follow lines sheets - large (x4)** (ideally pre-laminated to be used with a whiteboard pen)
- **Follow lines sheets - large (x2)** (ideally pre-laminated to be used with a whiteboard pen)
- **Draw and write sheets x4** (blank sheet, wide lines, narrow lines, only lines)
- **1 x 4-piece puzzle**
- **2 x 2-piece puzzle**
- **Rabbits Multimat** (for Colouring/Art & Craft/Loose Parts/Playdough)




Rabbits' teeth never stop growing!

Rabbits are very social animals. They feel most safe and secure when around other rabbits.




Rabbits can be easily frightened by loud noises and sudden movements. In fact, big shocks can be very bad for their health.




How *BIG* is a rabbit?
